

Lake Michigan, is home to craft-brew pubs, wine tasting rooms, fun restaurants, cafés, art galleries, boutiques, shops and Silver Beach Park. Gaze down at the park below and you'll see 1,600 feet of glistening beach, two historic lighthouses, and plenty of year-round family experiences. In the summer, jump over to the Whirlpool Compass Fountain splash pad to enjoy water cannons that spray 35 feet into the air providing a refreshing reprieve during hot sunny days. Don't miss visiting Lake Bluff Park for amazing sunsets over Lake Michigan, as well as hip summer concerts and craft fairs. As fall rolls in, visitors come from far and wide to experience spectacular autumn color tours, the annual Pumpkin Parade and Halloween activities. The holiday season begins with exciting events including Luminary, a downtown walking tour filled with luminaries lighting your way to shops, restaurants, and beverage tastings. Santa's House and the Reindog Parade are events in December to celebrate the Christmas season. To bring in the new year, come for the annual Chili Tour & Beer Fest in January, Ice Fest in February, and fun shopping events and an indoor Artisan Fair in March.

Benton Harbor sits right across the St. Joseph River, north of St. Joe, on the shore of Lake Michigan. Discover the Makers Trail offering gourmet cheeses, locally produced chocolates and other food delights while tasting wines, brews, ciders, and spirits at dozens of stops along the way. History & Architecture Tour: History and Architecture buffs will love to visit Southwest Michigan to explore its intriguing history. Discover unique architecture in St. Joseph and Benton Harbor and dive deeper into history at the Michigan Flywheelers Museum, Michigan Maritime Museum and North Berrien Historic Museum.



# Southwest Michigan Beaches

## Silver Beach County Park — St. Joseph

As you approach Lake Michigan on foot while walking in St. Joe, gaze out over the bluff and you'll see the majestic Silver Beach along the mouth of the St. Joseph River. With lively beach volleyball and laughter from children on the beach playground, families find Silver Beach a great gathering place for active adventure and fun. From sunbathing to riding the waves to building sandcastles, daily activities will keep those with abundant energy entertained. For a break from the action, stroll along the shore to the south pier to view the north pier lighthouses. Rent a paddleboard from the beachside concession or take a lake cruise aboard a charter boat. There are lifeguards on duty all summer long. Nearby there is also a friendly visitor's center and pavilion, bike racks, and bathhouses (open May through mid-October). The Park is open year-round with convenient parking off Broad Street (fee charged). Note: Leashed pets are allowed on sidewalks but are not allowed on the sand or in the water.

## Warren Dunes State Park — Sawyer

One of the most visited and popular beaches in Michigan is located at Warren Dunes State Park. With three miles of beachfront and huge sand dunes to climb, it's perfect for lounging and picnicking with friends and swimming in the refreshing waters of Lake Michigan. Hiking along the park's trails is popular for fitness buffs and nature lovers, offering amazing views of the big lake and the towering dunes. One of the park's many draws is the dog beach just north of the northernmost parking area. Here you can bring your furry friends to swim in Lake Michigan and relax on the shore. Dogs are also permitted on leash on the six miles of trails, boardwalks and in the campgrounds. Arrive at the park to take in a sunset or later, on a clear night, "skygaze" millions of stars, planets, and other celestial objects. In the winter, the six miles of trails also offer great cross-country skiing. Parking is abundant close to the beach and there are renovated bathrooms and showers, a gift shop, concession, and food trucks in the warmer months. Note: To enter the park, you'll need a Michigan Recreation Passport. Visit Michigan.gov/RecreationPassport for more information and to purchase.



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## Jean Klock Park — Benton Harbor

Jean Klock Park is a historic park and one of the oldest parks in Michigan. One of its many features is the half-mile-long sandy Lake Michigan beach which includes a great bathhouse, food concession and a covered pavilion for picnicking. There's an observation tower which allows visitors a great place to snap photos with lovely views of the shoreline, and a natural boardwalk from the paved parking area to the beach. Jean Klock Park is convenient for the entire family and an easy trip from both downtown Benton Harbor and St. Joseph. All ages will love the kayaks and paddleboards for rent and there are volleyball courts and a nice playground with a slide and swings for young children. There is a charge to park at Jean Klock Park.

## **Grand Mere State Park** — Stevensville

Designated as a National Landmark by the U.S. Congress in 1976, Grand Mere State Park is a hidden treasure for outdoor adventurists. Protected from Lake Michigan by the dunes, Grand Mere offers many natural features not found anywhere else in Michigan. This 985-acre oasis features an unusual set of dunes that have resulted in a diverse ecosystem that is uniquely special. Adventurers will be in their element on the walk from the parking area to the beach. Prepare to climb up and down, about a mile, through gorgeous, forested trails and through the majestic sand dunes. When you arrive, the sight of endless water along the Lake Michigan shore will have you transfixed! In the heated summer months head straight to the water where you'll feel one with nature as you float on your back gazing up at the bright sun and clouds. In the spring and fall, discover hundreds of birds – up to 250 species – that soar through the park on a major migration path. In the winter, cross country skiing and snowshoeing offer a glorious experience for heartier souls who can manage undeveloped areas and wild terrain. Keep in mind that the trails are not groomed and there is no ski rental concession at the park. There is no admission to the park and the bathroom facilities are modest. The park also allows picnicking and dogs on leash.

## Weko Beach — Bridgman

Weko Beach in Bridgman is perfect for families and those who prefer a smaller intimate beach setting. Children enjoy Weko Beach for its shallow areas and fun sandbars. Weko's Beach House is perfect for day-long relaxing with nice restrooms, changing rooms, outdoor showers, and a concession. Play all day long and easily transition to an afternoon excursion or an eatery nearby. Plan to be at Weko Beach during a summer sunset to experience the magical sound of Taps being played by buglers who mirror the verses of this Civil War cry from near and far away. Sit in the sand or on your beach chair to view the gorgeous orange sunset as it slowly descends into the vast waters of Lake Michigan while the melody of Taps floats in the breeze.









February, Ice Fest will take place February 3rd through 5th, 2023,

promising a delightful weekend of frosty fun featuring professional ice carving artists, amazing ice sculptures, and exciting happenings along St. Joseph's downtown streets.

The action begins on Friday evening with ten master carvers competing head-to-head in the Professional Individual Competition. Master ice carvers from all over the country will show their skills using chisels, chainsaws, clippers, and torches to create elaborate art made of ice. After the competition, visitors love to gather around the Fire & Ice Tower, a giant bonfire made with glistening blocks of ice. Stop by the St. Joseph Today Welcome Center, located nearby, to learn more about activities taking place all weekend.

Early Saturday morning, step out onto the snowy streets to watch five professional teams compete in the Team Ice Carving Competition. From 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. master carvers will design intriguing ice objects right before your eyes. Enjoy a magician performing fascinating tricks on the corner of State and Pleasant streets at 1 p.m., and then again at the Shadowland on Silver Beach at 4pm.

Visitors are encouraged to bundle up for the festivities to engage in their own challenges at the Ice Interactives area. Games like frozen Tic-Tac-Toe, the frozen Fish Toss and Ice Bowling will have visitors howling with laughter as volunteers guide them in these amateur competitions!

Don't forget to pick up a Scavenger Hunt map at the St. Joseph Today Welcome Center to search for clues at many local locations for a chance to win an exciting St. Joe Today gift certificate. Throughout your stay, wander into shops and restaurants to experience wonderful food and beverages and unique gift buying.

# Discover the Big Ships and Lighthouses of Southwest Michigan

t's such a thrill to watch the freighters arrive and depart along the St. Joseph River! Elegantly gliding into shore, visitors love to capture this vision and watch as they are expertly navigated through the channel.

The best places for viewing the big ships include Silver Beach County Park along the south pier and Tiscornia Park along the north pier. The Inn at Harbor Shores is also an excellent place for viewing. In fact, as they turn, the ships get extremely close to the Inn, where you can truly appreciate their massive scale. Sip a drink at Plank's Tavern on the Water at the Inn as you watch for big ships passing by. It doesn't happen every day, but when it does, it's a sight to behold!

As you watch the boats large and small navigate through the channel take note of the north pier lighthouses that have been crucial to navigation for at least 190 years and remain so

presently to one and all who travel the Great Lakes and stop in these popular ports. The Outer Lighthouse stands 35 feet in height and the Inner Lighthouse also has a critical function for sailors navigating into the channel. Each of the lighthouses consist of two lights known as "Range Lights" that sailors need to align to ensure that they are entering straight into the channel. When the lights align, captains know they are on target to enter the St. Joseph River



St. Joe's fascinating lighthouse history is alive today along the piers. Tour guides from The Heritage Museum & Cultural Center conduct seasonal public tours between Memorial Day and Labor Day, telling the stories about lighthouse keepers who once maintained the lights and guided the vessels that critically relied on them to safely make port.

With sixteen destinations to choose from and 75 events to inspire your travel calendar, what could be better?

The Creative Connections game is easy! Here's how to play:

Get your brochure at any of the Creative Connections destinations listed online once you arrive in SW Michigan. The Southwest Michigan Tourist Council at 2300 Pipestone Rd. in Benton Harbor also has brochures for pickup or you can request a brochure from them online at swmichigan.org/creative.

Use the Creative Connections brochure to keep track of where you've traveled. Throughout your journey, collect destination stamps at each of your sites. Each destination has a unique stamp. The more stamps you collect, the more prizes you can earn.

There are different playing levels. Depending on your stay, you can do a little or a lot.

Level 1: Collect 3 different Creative Connections destination stamps.

**Level 2:** Collect 6 different Creative Connections destination stamps.

# Social Districts in SW Michigan

Discover the new social districts in St. Joseph, Niles, Bridgman and soon, Buchanan. Each of these four towns and cities have a unique social district footprint where you can graze from restaurants, bistros and bars selecting a variety of items from different menus that tickle your tastebuds. Throughout the experience, eat and drink to your heart's content in outdoor common areas where the mood is lively and the interaction with others is so much fun!

## Here's generally how these four social districts work in Southwest Michigan:

Everyone is welcome, but only those of age can drink. Only those 21 years and up can purchase an alcoholic beverage in the social district.

Purchase food and beverages at participating businesses. Think of our social districts as one big food court. Grab a drink while you wait for your seat at a restaurant, or come with a group and grab different things, then reconvene. All participating businesses will have signage and social district cups.

Finish your drink before you leave. Social district alcoholic beverages can't be removed from common area boundaries marked by outdoor district signage. Make sure to look at the specific boundaries before you visit. For instance, in St. Joseph you cannot cross Main Street with your drink even though the social district is on both sides of it.

Enjoy those drinks outside! Alcoholic beverages purchased at one establishment cannot be taken into any other establishment. Lucky for you, all locations have a fun, outdoor atmosphere where you can enjoy your drinks and window shop. If you see something you like, whether it's food or a neat shirt, finish your drink before going into the next business unless they have signage allowing it.

When you finish the last drop, toss the cup. Social district cups are not reusable. If you'd like a souvenir glass or growler, just ask! Several businesses sell their own swag right on site.

Leave your drinks at home, we have plenty here. Outside alcoholic beverages may not be brought into the common areas.

Remember to "Drink Responsibly while having Fun!"


